Individual Recognition Award Irene Hurley

Families who come to ride Glen Echo Park's beloved Dentzel carousel have had the pleasure for more than a quarter century of being greeted by Irene Hurley, always wearing her trademark hat. This year marks the 27th season that Irene and her son Max have operated the 1921 carousel. Irene, 84, is best known for selling tickets and ensuring the safety of all patrons by enforcing the rule that "everyone under eight must be accompanied by a paying adult." Irene's relationship with the park goes back to the 1940s, when she went to dances in the Spanish Ballroom.

Organizational Achievement Award Adventure Theatre Carol Leahy, Executive Director and President of the Board of Directors

It is impossible to honor Adventure Theatre without paying tribute to Carol Leahy. Carol has served in nearly every leading role—Executive Director, President, Artistic Director, and even as Mother Goose—in the Greater Washington Area's longest-running theater for children. Founded 52 years ago, Adventure Theatre has been an anchor at Glen Echo Park since the early 1970s. Under Carol's leadership, Adventure Theatre recently embarked on a major campaign to renovate its building and extend its reach into the community.

Friend of Glen Echo Park Awards Senator Charles "Mac" Mathias, Jr. Senator Paul Sarbanes

U. S. Senators Charles "Mac" Mathias, Jr. and Paul Sarbanes of Maryland have been champions for Glen Echo Park at critical times in the park's history.

Republican Senator Mac Mathias, who served in the House of Representatives from 1961 to 1969 and in the Senate from 1969 to 1987, was instrumental in arranging for the park to be transfered from private owners to the federal government in 1969-1970. The private owners had wanted to convert the park to a high-rise development

Democratic Senator Paul Sarbanes, who served in the House of Representatives from 1971 to 1977 and in the Senate since 1977, has been helping to obtain critical renovation funds for Glen Echo Park since the late 1990s.

The commitment of Senators Mathias and Sarbanes to ensuring the future of Glen Echo Park comes from their longstanding interest in the park and their desire to preserve the natural landscape and scenic panorama of the Potomac Palisades.


