BIOGRAPHIES

Maryland Lieutenant Governor Anthony G. Brown Friend of Glen Echo Park Award

Maryland Lieutenant Governor Anthony G. Brown has dedicated his life to public service. Now in his second term as Lt. Governor, he has transformed what was once a largely undefined and ceremonial position into one of substance, making great strides for Maryland's working families.

Working in partnership with Governor Martin O'Malley, Lt. Governor Brown has worked to improve healthcare and strengthen Maryland's schools. He has also made it a priority to save taxpayer dollars and create jobs by increasing private investment in public infrastructure projects, such as roads, schools and bridges. In addition, the O'Malley-Brown administration has been a great friend to the Maryland cultural community through strong and continued funding of the Maryland State Arts Council.

Prior to serving as Lt. Governor, Brown represented Prince George's County for two terms in the Maryland House of Delegates, rising quickly to the position of Majority Whip. He is a graduate of Harvard College and Harvard Law School. A Colonel in the United States Army Reserves, Lt. Governor Brown is the nation's highest-ranking elected official to have served a tour of duty in Iraq.

Art Glass Center at Glen Echo Organizational Achievement Award

The Art Glass Center was founded in 1982 under the direction of glass artist Marilyn Nugent, who taught fused glass and Venetian bead making classes in a small studio at the Park. The program grew when a group of artists including Jerry Zayde Sleph, Bobbi Vischi, and Christine Hekimian established the ArtGlass Consortium in 1996. When the renovation and expansion of the studio was completed in 2004, additional resident artists joined

the group and a renewal began. The name was changed to the Art Glass Center at Glen Echo.

Currently the Art Glass Center community consists of seven resident artists and ten studio artists working and creating glass art at the Center. The resident artists along with other professional artists offer classes in casting, pate de verre, mosaics, Venetian glass bead making, flameworking, color and design, painting on glass, and other kiln formed or fused glass techniques. The Zayde Art Glass Gallery at the Center features sculptural glass art, functional pieces, and jewelry created by the residents artists.

Glen Echo Glassworks Organizational Achievement Award

Founded in 1991 by Rick Sherbert, Glen Echo Glassworks was the first glass school in the Washington area. Today it continues to provide outstanding blown glass instruction, exhibitions, and special programs under the direction of artist-in-residence Paul Swartwood. Classes are offered year round for beginner through advanced students, and open studio time is available for experienced artists. Located in the former Caretaker's Cottage, the studio is open to the public for glassblowing demonstrations and viewing works.

Swartwood was first introduced to blown glass in 2000 and was so taken by the process that he began studying glassblowing and sculpture at Salisbury University, where he earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts. For four years, he produced crystalware at the renowned Simon Pearce glass company. In 2007, Swartwood began teaching and working at Glassworks under the direction of Sherbert. Closed temporarily for renovations in 2008, Glassworks reopened under the leadership of Swartwood in 2009. Over the years, Swartwood has been influenced primarily by Italian and Swedish techniques, admiring the infinite combinations of color explored by Italian artists and the luscious heaviness mastered by Swedish artists. He has exhibited his work

in several galleries along the east coast and has demonstrated his glassblowing techniques at numerous studios and universities.

Embassy of Italy's Year of Italian Culture in the United States

The Year of Italian Culture in the United States is a year-long program of events designed to promote Italian culture, engage Americans, and strengthen the bonds between Italy and the United States. These events celebrate Italian culture and identity in areas that have distinguished Italian traditions, including: art, music, stage, landscaping and architectural heritage, cinema, literature, the sciences, design, fashion, and food culture.

Inspired by the brilliance of Italy's art glass traditions and as part of the celebration of 2013 as the Year of Italian Culture, the Glen Echo Park Partnership collaborated with the Italian Embassy to present the *Glimmer of Glass Gala*. Representing the Embassy is Cultural Attaché Renato Miracco, an art critic, art historian, and museum curator.

William Gudenrath, The Corning Museum of Glass

William Gudenrath, Resident Adviser for The Studio of The Corning Museum of Glass, is a glassblower, scholar, lecturer and teacher. He is an authority on historical glassworking techniques from ancient Egypt through the Renaissance, and has presented lectures and demonstrations throughout the world. As Resident Adviser for The Studio, Gudenrath ensures excellence in the facility and its programs and regularly teaches introductory and advanced courses in Venetian techniques.

Gudenrath received degrees in music from North Texas State University and the Juilliard School, and is on the International Advisory Committee UrbanGlass in Brooklyn, New York. His works are sold in the Museum's GlassMarket, as well as other exclusive stores and galleries nationwide.

As a precursor to the *Glimmer of Glass Gala*, Gudenrath visited the Park in April to give an Artist Talk, present glassblowing demonstrations, and teach a master class for advanced glassblowing students.

Alison Starling Emcee

Alison Starling anchors the 5 pm and 11 pm newscasts for ABC7. Starling has been with ABC7 News since January 2004. She came to ABC7 from KIRO-TV in Seattle. In 2012, she won Emmys for Best Anchor and for Continuing Coverage of the 2011 Earthquake. Starling also produces the very popular Working Woman series on ABC7. The program profiles accomplished, respected women in the Washington area who contribute to the community in unique ways. She enjoys working with a number of charitable organizations in the metro area, including the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society and Big Brothers Big Sisters where she serves as a member of the board and was named the National Capital Region's Big Sister of the Year. A native Floridian, Starling graduated from the University of Florida.
